

**REPORT - ELECTION – NOVEMBER 3rd, 2013  
Municipality of Low**

The returning officer’s envelope was received September 1, 2013.

The public notice of election was posted on September 20, 2013.

The period for the declaration of candidacy was open from September 20 to October 4 at 4:30PM.

During this period, the Mayor, Morris O’Connor and Councillor Charles Kealey were re-elected by acclamation. The following twelve (12) declarations of candidacy were presented within the time period prescribed by the Elections and Referendums Act:

We communicated with non-residents to remind them of their right to vote and the procedure for registering on the voters list August 28, 2013.

A Public Notice of Election was posted September 20, 2013.

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, the election list was deposited at 3PM. The election list contained 1 045 voters.

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, Morris O’Connor and Charles Kealey were proclaimed as Mayor and Councillor respectively.

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 1000 ballots per seat were ordered from Imprimak in Maniwaki as well as the necessary envelopes for the advance voting and Election Day from Formules Municipales.

The envelopes were received the afternoon of October 9<sup>th</sup>.

On October 12<sup>th</sup> the necessary forms for the election and for revision of the electoral list were posted.

On October 12<sup>th</sup> the notice «Are you on the voting list» SM-15-2 was sent by mail.

On October 16 and 17, the commission for the revision of the electoral list took place. In the end, the voters list contained 1062 voters.

On October 22<sup>th</sup> an all candidates meeting took place at the Heritage Hall, from 7:30PM to 9:30PM facilitated by Michael Francis. Everything went well. All candidates were present.

The 27<sup>h</sup> of October, the advance poll was held from 12:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. One hundred and three (103) electors exercised their right to vote representing 11% of eligible voters. In all, it went well.

On October 28, an information session took place with the election staff.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> of November, the day of election, the election employees arrived at their voting stations at 9:00 a.m. The doors were open at 10:00 a.m. and closed at 8:00 p.m. In general the day unfolded without any issues.

Four hundred and thirty (430) electors used their right to vote representing 41% participation. No request for judicial recount was presented within the period of four (4) days that followed the polling date.
