PAPER & CARDBOARD



- Newspapers, circulars, magazines
- Paper, envelopes and paper bags
- Books, telephone books
- Cardboard tubes
- Cardboard boxes
- Egg cartons
- Juice and milk containers
- Aseptic containers (ex. Tetra Pak™)

PLASTIC



- All plastic **containers, bottles** and **wrapping** that are identified with the following symbols:



- Lids and covers
- Plastic bags and film*

*Considering the difficulties associated with the markets for these plastics, Tricentris encourages you to look for alternatives whenever possible and to favor their reuse before depositing in the recycling bin.

METAL



- Aluminium foil and containers
- Aluminium bottles and cans
- Cans
- Lids and covers
- Refundable cans

GLASS



Food and beverage **containers, bottles, and jars** (all colors)

HOW TO RECYCLE?

- **Lightly** rinse all containers.
- Include only clean and **unwaxed** paper and cardboard.
- To facilitate the sorting process, place all shredded paper in a transparent bag. Please do the same (a bag of bags) for all plastic bags and film. Leave all other recyclables loose in the bin.
- Dispose of all #6 (polystyrene) as well as any plastic item that is not identified with a recycling symbol.
- Please attach metal coat hangers together in a bundle.

According to a study of residential recycling bins conducted in 2010 by Éco Entreprises and Recyc-Québec, it is estimated that up to 10% of its contents would be better suited for treatment in another facility: a used clothing or furniture store, an eco-center, a composting facility or the landfill.

Please consult with your municipality for more information on the following items:

- Construction material (vinyl siding, wood, plumbing material, tools, etc.)
- Household hazardous waste: car batteries, batteries, propane tanks, paint, tires, compact fluorescents, etc.
- Electronics: computers, televisions, cell phones, etc.
- Textiles
- Compost

Used clothing and furniture stores, eco-centers and composting centers are equipped to give a second life to these items. If reuse or recycling is not an option, they will be responsibly eliminated.
